

Writing Prompts

Today you have a snow day! First read the options for writing prompts from the list below, you are going to pick one of the following topics to write about. You cannot pick one you have written about before. Using the separate paper, spend a short amount of time for pre-writing activities (such as brainstorming, listing, free writing, clustering, mapping, or drawing). After you finish your prewriting activity, write your paper in your best hand writing.

2nd – 3rd Grade

You will be writing two paragraphs about your topic. Each paragraph needs to have 5 complete sentences. Each sentence needs to have 5 words or more.

4th – 6th

You will be writing three paragraphs about your topic. Each paragraph needs to have 5 complete sentences. Each sentence needs to have 8 words or more.

Remember to make sure you:

- Indent your paragraphs
- Check capitalization
- Check punctuation
- Check Grammar
- Described your character and setting in detail
- Have a problem and solution
- Check your spelling, if you don't know sound it out!

Writing Topics

1. If you could cook any meal for your family, what would you cook? Describe the meal and tell how you would make it.
2. Imagine you woke up and saw a dinosaur in your backyard. Write a story telling what you see and do.
3. Imagine you opened your own restaurant. Tell the name of your restaurant. Explain what the restaurant looks like, who works there and what you serve.
4. Describe your favorite season (fall, spring, summer or winter). Tell what kinds of things you like to do during that season.
5. If you could have lunch with any famous person who would it be? What would you talk about with this person? What would you eat?
6. Which superpower would you most like to have – invisibility, super strength or the ability to fly? Describe what kinds of things you would do with your powers.
7. Write a story titled “The Baby Dragon.”
8. Would you want to visit the moon? Why or why not?
