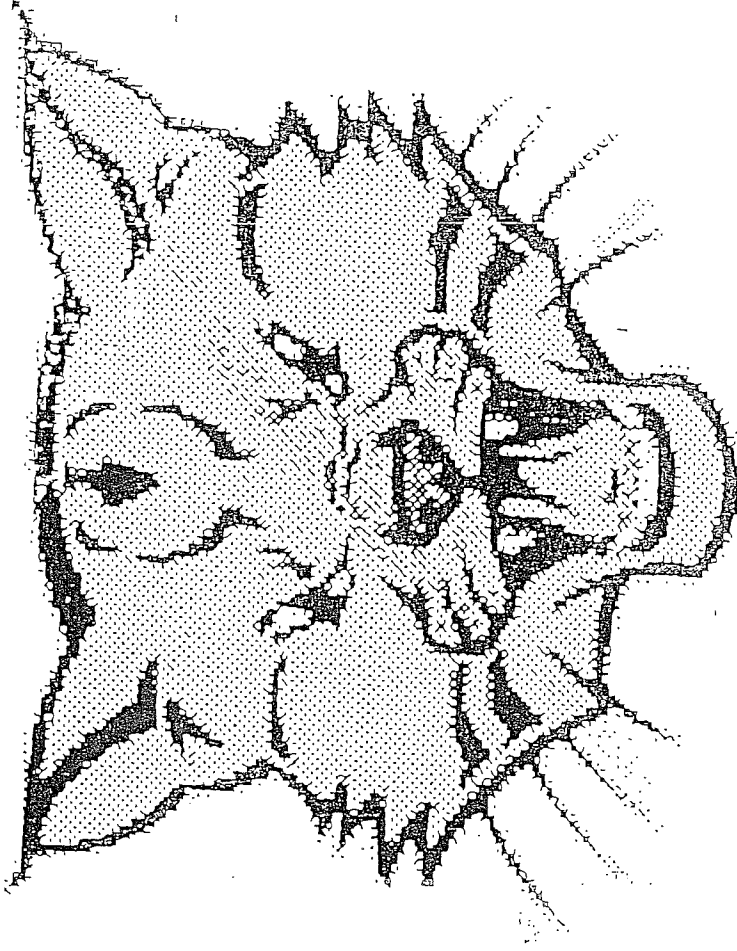
*Oral presentations were given regarding the following questions:*

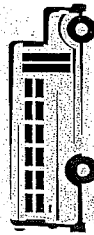
## School Goals
